Cabin Fever? Here Are 13 Great NJ Trails

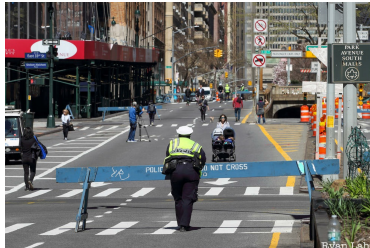

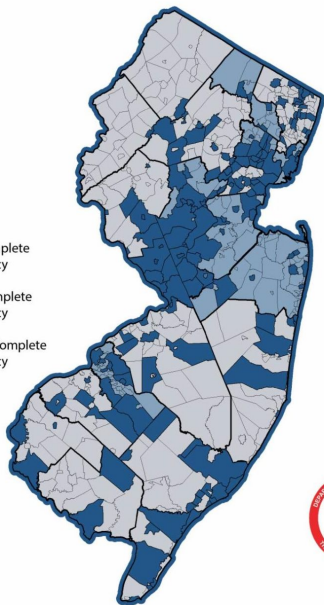
